

PLANNING 10

Credits: 4

Purpose: Planning 10 is a ministry required course intended to initiate career exploration and develop financial literacy and health awareness. The rationale of the course is to enable students to develop the skills, knowledge, attitudes and competencies they need to become humble servants of God and neighbour. To encourage students to make life choices that reflect a biblical worldview and understand their personal choices within community responsibility.

Outline: At SCS we have chosen to integrate this course into various units within the grade 9-12 curriculum instead of teaching it as a separate course. Therefore, if a student leaves SCS after Gr.10 they will not have a Planning 10 mark and will have to enroll in Planning 10 at their new school. If a student chooses to leave SCS after Gr. 11 they must arrange with our school to receive a final mark based on what they have completed.

Skills Developed: Students will become wise and faithful decision makers, able to understand the impact of their choices on themselves and others. Students will be able to access life-choice information and analyze it for accuracy, bias and relevance. Develop an understanding of their personal responsibility for attaining and maintaining themselves as healthy individuals who demonstrate a commitment to fitness and active living, personal life-management, and spiritual, physical and emotional well-being; and as community contributors, who willingly serve others and take the initiative to improve the quality of life of other people in the world around them.
