Social Justice operates from the Biblical framework that all humans are made in God's image and all creation has been declared good (Gen. 1). The course will provide students with the ability to identify and define social problems, justice, and social injustice and then determine past and present social injustices in Canada and in the world, their possible causes, and their lasting impact on individuals, groups, and society. Further, the roles of governmental and non-governmental organizations in issues of social justice and injustice are explored. Based on the model of: learning to identify problems and injustices, researching about them, engaging in redemptive actions, and finally educating others about the issues, this course lends itself to be a practical output of our faith in Christ.
